
About the Key Program

Teen drinking can lead to serious consequences, for you as well as your children. The Parent and Police Partnership Key Program is a new free service for area parents aimed at decreasing the number of parties where underage drinking occurs. It keeps your children safe and your home free from damage. It gives you peace of mind.

The program works as follows:

If you plan to leave your teen at home without supervision while you are away, you may register for safety checks with your local police department.

You simply visit the police department, tell them where and when you are going and give them the name and address of a responsible contact person who can act as a key holder. If the police notice anything out of the ordinary during a safety check, they will, with your permission, retrieve the key from your contact person and enter the house. You, as a parent, will be notified of any problems.



Youth, Alcohol and Other Drugs

- Purchase and public possession of alcohol by people under the age of 21 is illegal in all 50 states.
- First use of alcohol typically begins around age 13; marijuana around 14. (NIDA, "Drug among Racial/Ethnic Minorities", 1995, p. 31)
- Approximately 8% of the nation's eighth graders; and 32% of twelfth graders have been drunk the last month; 12%, 23% and 25% respectively, have used illicit drugs (NIDA, 2000 "Monitoring the Future Study, Secondary Students")
- 47% of high school students from Cape Elizabeth admit consuming alcohol in the past 30 days.
- 2.6 million teenagers do not realize that a person can die from an alcohol overdose.
- Alcohol is implicated in two thirds of sexual assaults and date rape cases among teens and college students.
- 40%-50% of young males who drown used alcohol prior to drowning.
- Alcohol is implicated in more than 40% of all academic problems and in 28% of all dropouts.
- 50% of vehicle fatalities among 15 -24 year olds in our KEYS communities are alcohol related (vs. 37% nationally).
- The average college student spends more money for alcohol than books.
- If you allow underage drinking parties in your home you might be charged with both civil and criminal liability.

Alcohol is the number one drug problem among teenagers, 28% of 12-20 year old admitted to having drunk at least one alcoholic beverage in the past month. (Local survey shows our percentages are higher than the National Institute.)

Empower your teenagers to make safe choices... while your away.
