The center aisle is 33" wide and 38' in length.





Flowers or other decorations may not be hung from or against the walls or windows, nor may any nails be used in the building.

The number of persons attending an event may not exceed 150. This level shall not be exceeded due to fire safety regulations.

Confetti, rice, birdseed, rose petals or any similar material may not be used in or near the church. No food or beverage, alcoholic beverages or otherwise, may be consumed.



The chandelier, which hangs in the middle of the church over the center aisle, is the only source of light within the church. In November 1895, the original chandelier fell and broke into pieces almost setting the church on fire. In those days the chandelier illuminated the church by candlelight. The present chandelier was purchased second hand. It was originally cast around 1850. It burned kerosene until electrified and refinished in 1982.

Due to fire regulations, burning candles and other lighting is not permitted in or near the church.




The pump organ dates from 1890. It was donated to the church by a Miss Ida Brown in 1922.

Parking Lot

Parking for events shall be in the designated parking lot. The grass-covered lot is located across the street from the church.

A parking attendant is required when 75 attendees are expected to attend the event.
