•Winnick Wood Improvements. The Cape Elizabeth Conservation Committee has wrapped up its third successful partnership with the Maine Conservation Corps (MCC) with an impressive four plus projects completed in Winnick Woods. The MCC Team arrived August 19th, pitched their tents at the Public Works Garage, and began transforming the lumber pile in the parking lot into new boardwalks. The Public Works Department again were gracious hosts, sharing facilities and access to power for recharging. The improvements are part of the 2020 FB Environmental Trail Assessment, and permits have been obtained for Winnick Woods improvements.





Worn boards on existing boardwalks have been replaced.



The main trail in Winnick Woods is terminally muddy in the spring. This new boardwalk provides a dry surface for trail users and is offset to accommodate access for mowing equipment.
