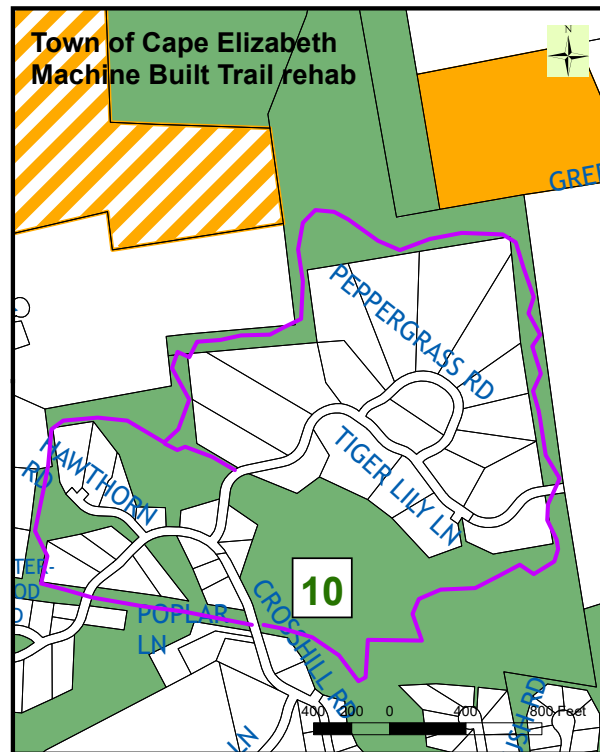

•**Cross Hill Trail rehabilitation.** Work on the rehabilitation of a loop in the Cross Hill Trail system is well underway. The project, which began at the easterly crossing at Cross Hill has now advanced north of the Tiger Lily trail connection. Work is expected to continue as long as weather permits, and to continue in 2025.
