- 1. Welcome and introductions
- 2. Review and approval of the March minutes. Approved with no changes.
- 3. Treasurer's Report. Banner and bookmark invoices pending.
- 4. Update on all events
 - a) Submission to Cape Community Services for questions/reservations.

Everyone was happy with the content and positioning of the events list in the spring/summer brochure. Many thanks to Russell Packert and his staff!

- b) Review of events and report outs:
 - 1) Friday, May 1 banner installation Point person/s: Darren

The banners went to production last week with an expected twoweek turn around. Barbara and Darren intend to identify the 16 lamp posts selected for banner with tree tape. Darren will contact Bob Malley to arrange for the May 1 installation.

2) Friday, May 1 movie "premiere" and kick off reception Point person/s: Steph, Kathy & Debbie.

Thomas Campbell shared his film in its current form entitled *Cape Elizabeth: Time's Flowing Tide*. Bill Steele's voice over/narrative and a music score will be added to current footage and historic photos. Two interviews have been taped and he may try for one

more. Thomas assured the group that the timeline is on track for May 1. Thomas will also connect with Noel about technical set up. Everyone is VERY excited to see the final product! Barbara will coordinate with Mike McGovern on payment for that date.

Food: The Buzz will likely provide beverages, The Cookie Jar will provide pastries, C-Salt will provide an additional food items, The Good Table will provide mixed nuts and IGA will perhaps contribute another beverage, popcorn and cups. If needed, Kathy and Debbie will purchase cups and/or napkins and water.

Set up: Three tables and sufficient chairs are in Town Hall, Noel will coordinate audio/video and the screen with Thomas. There will be posted times of each showing (6:15, 6:45, 7:15, etc). Debbie, Kathy and Stephanie will meet at 3:30 that afternoon to set up. Other board members are available to pick up and deliver refreshments. Stephanie to prepare "Donated by . . ." signage for each donor.

Promotion: A press release was submitted for next Courier issue. Steph will also provide information to MPBN Community Calendar and Cape's Cable Access channel. She will check to see if it may be possible to promote child-friendly 250 events through the school newsletters or Facebook pages.

3) Saturday, May 2 and May 9, North and South Cape bus tours Point person/s: Norm & Jane

Barbara has confirmed 2 buses for each week to leave Community Services parking lot at 9 am and returning around 11 am. One bus to head North with Wayne (and perhaps a sub for Norm) and South with Joe and Jack – all tour leaders are volunteer members of the Cape Elizabeth Historical Preservation Society. 5) Wednesday, May 13 lecture by Earle Shettleworth and follow up tour of Delano Park on Saturday, May 16 Point person/s: Darren & Barbara

Darren will connect with Earle and Noel on audio/video and room set up. Follow up walk at Delano Park will be led by Bob Ayotte and is limited to 40. He will be present at the lecture to take names and furnish a map of where to park that morning. If a member of the public does not attend the lecture but wishes to attend the walk, Community Services will take names and alert Barbara.

6) Monday, May 25, Memorial Day Parade featuring banner & families Point person/s: Carol Anne & Randy

Permission has been granted to have the 250 banner and "Legacy" families walk (defined as 100 year old family connections with participants currently residing in Cape). Article will be placed in The Courier (due date May 1) to solicit interested family members, to include a list of families from historical records, and to also ask for families to contact Randy if their family name is not listed. An RSVP from one family member to Randy will initiate a sign for the parade. Tara Bucci's 4th grade class has volunteered to make the signs, and Randy will make the finished products. Randy will also connect with Carol Anne on additional details and submit the draft press release to Barbara by late April.

7) Saturday, June 13, Family Fun Day Point person: Debbie & Kathy

Randy offered to help find an antique flat bed truck to carry the birthday cake OR will offer his pick up truck. Debbie will order flags for children in the parade to carry – Little League members, Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, Brownies, bike riders, etc.

Amy Witt, who was recruited to lead this event, discussed her ideas regarding the Nosegay Event. The time selected was 9 am - 12 noon at Norm Jordan's garden – corner of Rt. 77 and Fowler Road (weather permitting). Amy will provide a narrative to Jane for the press release. Tables would be useful for arranging the nosegays - three are available at Town Hall if they are able to be borrowed and transported; a couple more may be available at the farm. Scissors may also be available at the farm. Amy will provide a discussion that day about the meaning of the flowers in each arrangement (up to 10 flowers may be cut) and instruct as to the use of floral tape, doilies, pins or ribbon. Amy will provide budget estimate to Jane soon for 100 nosegays.
