

STRAWBERRY FEST IDEAS

We could use the Chris Van Dusen theme and go with a "If I Designed (Built) A Town!" (Paul Seidman suggested we used "designed" instead of "built" to avoid perceptions that the plan is all about new buildings.)







We could have several copies of these books out on display and then have:

- 1. Simple, medium-sized black and white copies of Cape that leave room for additional drawings.
- One very large map of Cape that kids and adults can add their own suggestions to

 either directly on the map or pasting up their own drawings on square sheets of
 paper that we provide with markers.

3. Or a miscellaneous selection of cardboard boxes, empty towel rolls, construction paper, scissors, tape, etc. to build individual structures.

The other idea I came up with was running with the Minecraft theme (a digital gaming/building platform). There is actually a spin-off called Towncraft. All kids and parents know Minecraft.











Using similar fonts, we could call it Capecraft and then have:

- 1. Minecraft-like building material that kids could use to build things and then either take them home or attach them to a very large, map of Cape ... either horizontally or vertically displayed (on a table).
- 2. Include a visual list of available options; sidewalks, town square, shuttles, swimming pool, etc., which kids can use to place on the map.
