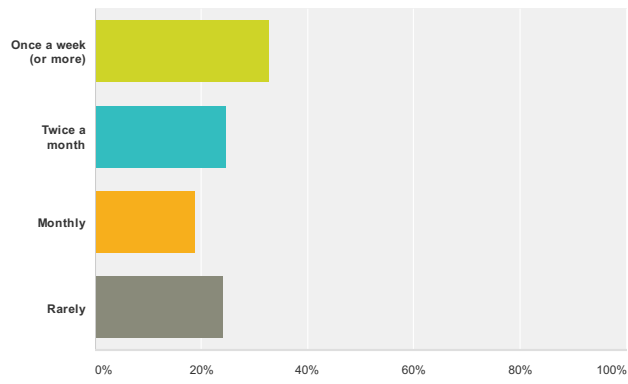


# Understanding the role of TML in Cape Elizabeth.

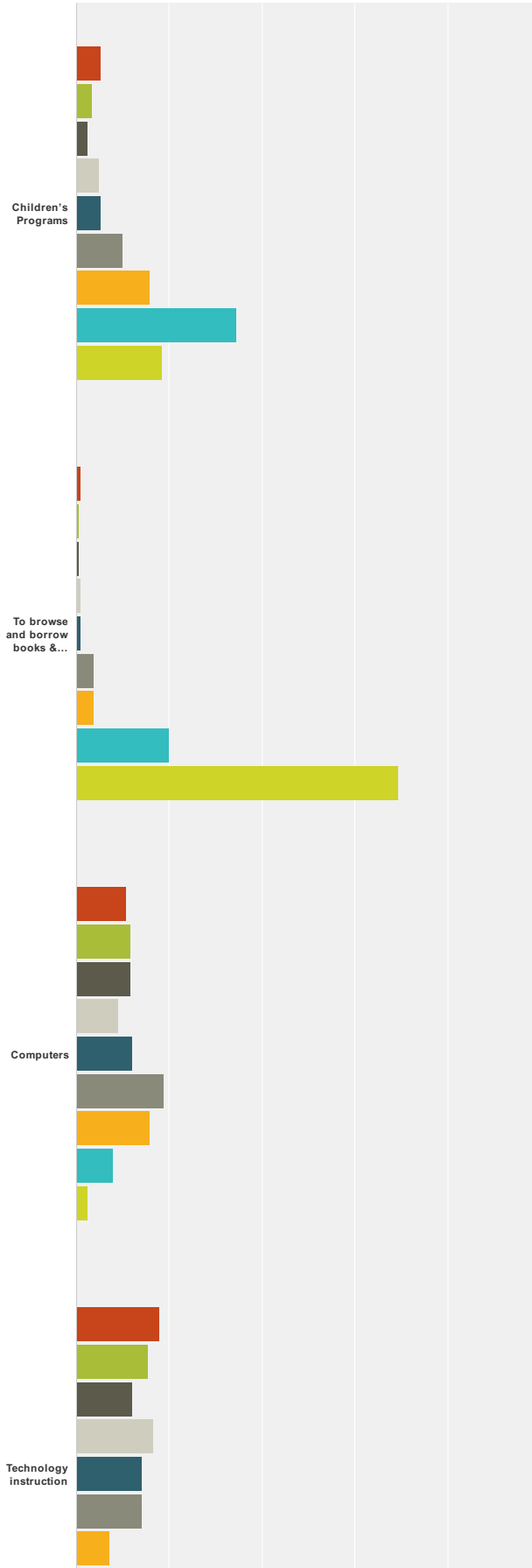

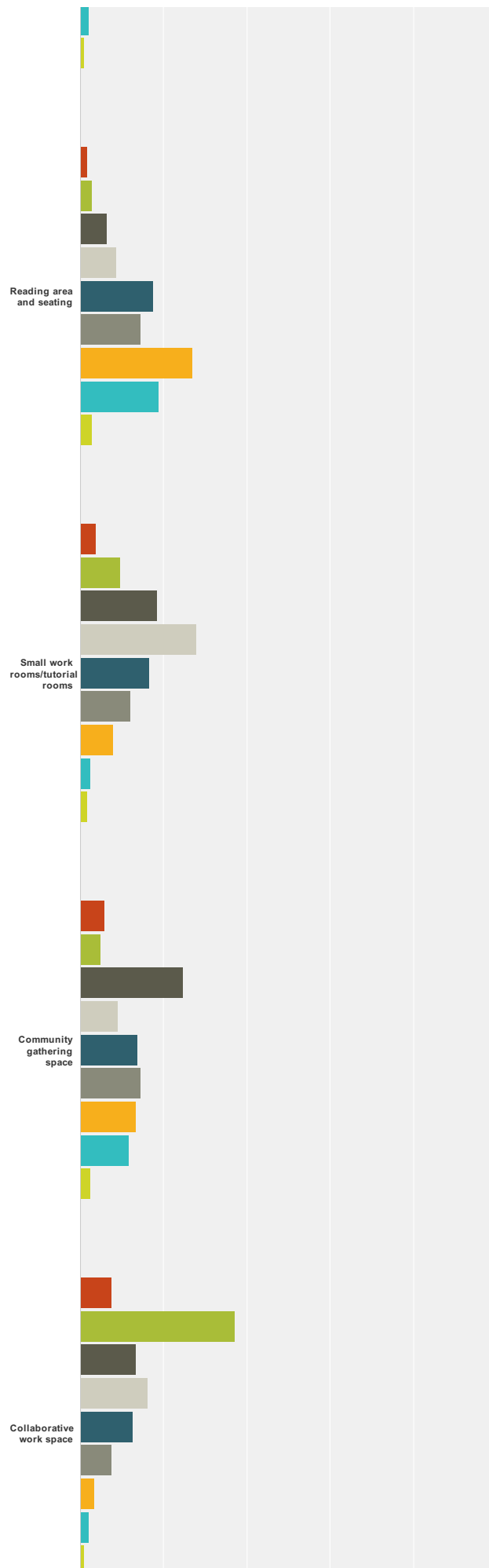

If you choose "collaborative work space as #2, it will then move into the second slot of the list, displacing what had been there previously. In this way, the survey respondent is asked to restructure the list until it represents, from top to bottom, the order of importance of these services.]

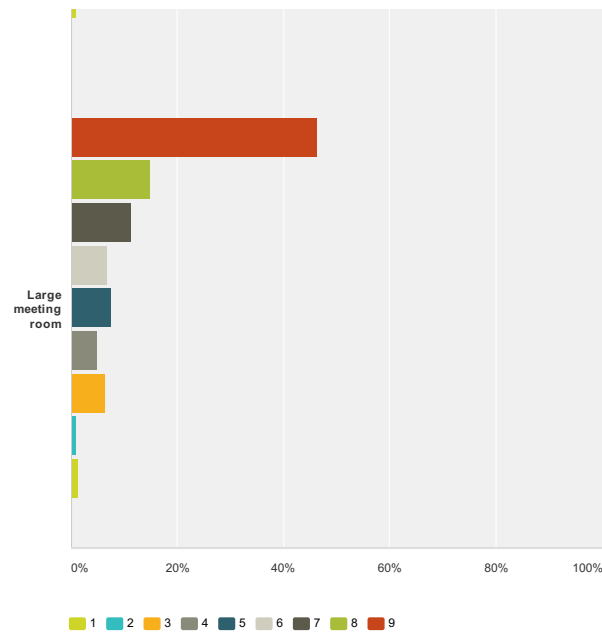

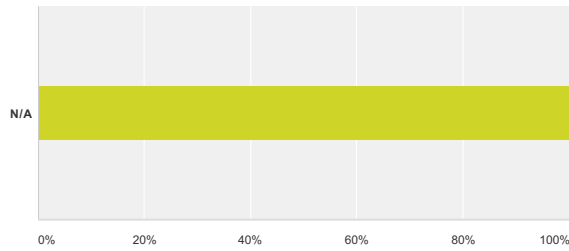

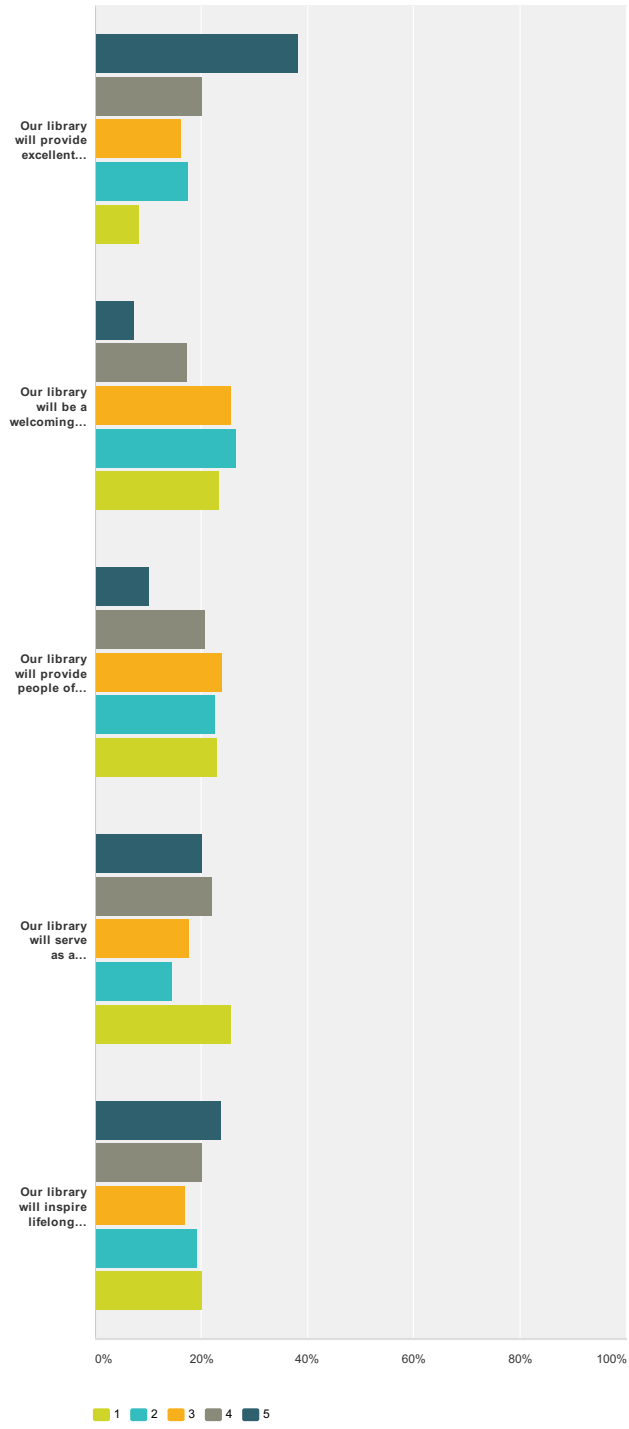
