The second meeting of the ad-hoc committee convened on Monday, July 18, 2005 at 7:05 p.m.

Approval of Minutes for June 6, 2005 meeting

Moved by C. Fritz and seconded by J. Beckwith to approve the minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

Discussion on Use of Facility – Janet Hannigan, Church Greeter

Janet Hannigan provided a great deal of information to the committee about usage:

- The facility is available for use from May 1st through October 31st
- Actual use is only 30-60 days per year
- Maximum capacity is 150 people
- Primarily used for weddings
 - Charges are \$325 for out-of-state, \$225 for in-state (\$50 return if kept in good condition)
 - 2-day rental 1 day rehearsal (1 hour) and 1 day wedding (2 hours)
- Also used for art shows, Portland String Quartet concerts, and pump organ recitals
- The CEHS used to have history class visits up until 2004
- Also used for funerals

Janet also provided information about promotional methods:

- Use of the Church is promoted on the Cape Elizabeth web site
- The Church was written up in *Down East* magazine
- She put together a brochure to promote weddings

Janet also discussed physical problems with the Church:

- Gaps in the foundation allow rodents into the Church
 - With the addition of heating in the winter, it increases the number of rodents nesting in the building
 - Rodents have done damage to the pump organ
- The bell tower leaks resulting in water damage to the vestibule and rodents nest in the vestibule because of openings in the bell tower
- Windows need to be replaced

Janet also provided some history about restorations of the physical property

- In March 1982, carpet was replaced with a reproduction of an original style carpet
- Shades and sheers have been replaced
- No bathroom facilities are in the Church (An outhouse is available at the graveyard)

Other comments

- Janet would like to see more involvement by the community in use of the Church
- Possible open houses to further educate the community about the history of the Church

Presentation of Information

Carol (for Millicent) - Maine Preservation Society

- Millicent contacted the Maine Preservation Society (MPS)
- MPS provided names of two preservation architects
 - Nancy Barba
 - Chris Glass (has a particular interest in churches)
- Committee consensus was that we would need the services of a preservation architect, however, it will be later in the process
- MPS said there were alternatives to improving the foundation without moving the building

Darren - Greater Portland Landmarks and Maine Historic Preservation Commission

- Darren provided a letter from the Maine Historic Preservation Commission (MHPC) a copy of which is attached
- We may want to get idea from similar churches in Maine that have been restored
 - A similar church is on Route 15 toward Biddeford Pool

Dan Historical information from town records

• Dan provided a summary of his research, a copy of which is attached
